

PIERO FOGLIATI

Originally from Canelli (1930), Piero Fogliati lived and worked predominantly in Turin. Starting from the 1950s, he devoted himself to visual arts, experimenting as a self-taught artist with both figurative and abstract-informal painting. His quest for a personal style and belief in the autonomy of artistic language soon merged with his strong passion for science and technology. By exploring sensory perception and natural phenomena, Fogliati constructed machines with a sublime and refined aesthetic connected to the visual-acoustic sphere.

Fogliati combined beauty and perception, demonstrating his trust in imagination as well as his sincere and joyful affection for humanity. His works are linked to the conception of the Fantastic City, a vast project of urban interventions where sounds, lights, atmospheric elements, and hydrogeological ecosystems transform into aesthetic and sensory experiences (a “global dream” that Fogliati developed starting in the early 1960s). During this period, he held his first solo exhibitions in Florence, Rome, and Turin, and participated in the Venice Biennales of 1978 and 1986, the ARTEC Japanese Biennale in Nagoya in 1997, and the “FASTER! BIGGER! BETTER! Signet works of the collections” exhibition in 2006 dedicated to contemporary art from the past fifty years at the ZKM in Karlsruhe. His recognition in Turin came in 2003 with an important retrospective titled “Piero Fogliati, the poet of light.”









Sonata a sette per aria e acqua

City Poetry

City Poetry stems from the artist's Fantastic City project, in which sounds, lights, atmospheric elements, and hydrogeological ecosystems transform into aesthetic and sensory experiences. Piero Fogliati dedicated his life to the study of perception. His ingenious and poetic installations, where art is movement, light, retina, and sensations, can only be understood if experienced. He manages to combine beauty and perception, man and machine coexisting in an ideal place: the Fantastic City, a vast project of urban interventions where sounds, lights, atmospheric elements, and hydrogeological ecosystems transform into aesthetic and sensory experiences.

"I have always had a great passion for technology and science, but I tried to invent a garment to lay over the objects of science, over phenomena. A garment that isolates the phenomenon itself but allows it to come out. A reversal that reaches our minds. 'I am a scientist who betrays science.' In other words, an artist-inventor who calls his works inventions and his drawings fixations." — Piero Fogliati



City Oasis

On the occasion of Art Week from April 12 to 14, 2023, Tempesta Gallery steps outside its Foro Bonaparte space to install part of the visionary artist Piero Fogliati's body of work in the seventeenth-century church of San Carlo al Lazzaretto in Porta Venezia. Piero Fogliati, a multifaceted figure and great experimenter, transformed mechanical and electrical "devices" into multisensory and atmospheric works, playing with light, movement, and perception. He imagined a Fantastic City inhabited by machines that could interpret natural phenomena and its primary elements, such as the wind, lake, and river soundizers, and the air and water sculptures in water.

Fogliati's fascination with the urbanized and technological world has always contrasted with his studies on the transformation of the environment and landscape. From this reflection comes the installation project designed for the Church of San Carlo al Lazzaretto in Milan, in the lively Porta Venezia district, which leads the viewer into an "oasis of poetry" for a moment of escape from the chaotic city environment and total visual and acoustic immersion.

A project open to the public, accompanying the Fogliati retrospective City Poetry at the gallery, welcomes visitors on a journey through four iconic works that set up the octagonal space of the Church.


Reale Virtuale, consisting of a very thin, hand-blown glass ampoule placed above a projector specifically built by the artist, inside which two objects have been inserted. As the title suggests, one is real, while the other is its virtual, equivalent but mirrored copy. Prisma Meccanico, composed of a synthetic light projector and an aluminum support shaped like a white-painted disc, vertical and rotating at high speed, which collects light and reflects it, breaking it down into a suggestive chromatic range.

Le Latomie, constructed from curved tubes of different sizes, capable of modifying all external noises, transforming them into a continuous, ever-changing, and engaging sound.






